




SAFETY PATROL





















CHEERLEADERS





With the addition of Braintree in the Bay State League, Natick played a sixteen game league schedule. Like last year's great team, this year's team won fourteen league games. The only set-backs were by Norwood, who stopped our winning streak at 25, and Framingham in a close, dramatic game in which we saw everything that could happen in a traditional Natick-Framingham battle. We were in contention for the championship right down to the finish, but we had to settle for second place, although two notches higher than the "experts" had predicted. This team will rate with the team before it. Though we were not even considered to get by the quarter finals in the Tech Tourney, we came from behind in the Winthrop game to enter the semi-finals. We came from behind again in the semi-final, winning on a last second basket and entering the state final against Belmont for the second year in a row. Belmont, being bigger and more experienced, was full of revenge remembering last year's beating at the hands of Natick. However, they were not briefed on the Natick spirit, though they out-played us in the first half. Natick out-played them in the second half, but Belmont won the title on the free throw line, even though both teams had 24 field goals.

This team will surely go down as one of Natick's great basketball teams. With only one starter returning, our Co-Captain Dave Morgan, most valuable player who led the Bay State League in the rebounds, and Co-Captain Clayton Cox, a fine all-around player, a fine team was developed. Richard Wells, a junior, played an outstanding game all season, as did Alan Loane, who was a great ball handler and whose midcourt set shots gave crowds their thrills; senior, John Bouzan was injured at the end of the season, but a consistant rebounder and scorer. He will be remembered for his winning lay-up in the semi-final game of the Tech Tourney; Wilbur Barry will be remembered as the spark that ignited many a fire, Bruce Carter and John Hassard, with Boyd Walser gave the team a strong bench.


At the awards assembly Ron Chisholm was presented the Ralph H. Howard Memorial Trophy as the most valuable hockey player.






